

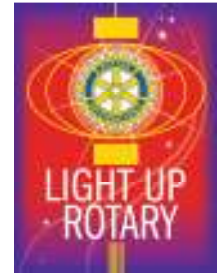

**This week's speaker will be funding Executive Director of the International Spy Museum, Peter Earnest, who will update us on what is happening at the museum**



**Peter Earnest**

Peter Earnest's 36-year CIA career included over 25 years in the Agency's Clandestine Service serving in Europe and the Middle East. Assigned to various cover positions as a field operative, he handled intelligence sources, double agents, defectors, and covert action assets. He headed the special CIA Task Force to oversee the resettlement of the highest ranking Soviet official to defect to the United States. In the Office of the Director of Central Intelligence, he served with the CIA's Inspector General, as head of its Legislative Staff to the U.S. Senate, and as Director of Media Relations and spokesman for Directors Webster, Gates, and Woolsey. A member of the CIA's Senior Executive Service (SES), he was awarded the Agency's Intelligence Medal of Merit in 1994. After leaving the Agency, he founded ClassAct Video Productions, Ltd. He was named founding Executive Director of the International Spy Museum in 2002. He has led the Museum through its eleven years of extraordinary success, welcoming over 6.5 million visitors, mounting a traveling exhibit on terrorism in America, and creating a rich program of speakers, events, publications, and podcasts. Frequently interviewed by the press, radio and TV, particularly during fast-breaking espionage cases, he also appeared two weeks running on the Colbert Show in 2008. He authored the Museum's popular Handbook to Practical Spying, The Real Spy's Guide to Becoming a Spy; and Business Confidential, a management manual based on CIA practices; and has edited several other Museum collaborative publications. He also served as President and Chairman of the Board of the Association of Former Intelligence Officers (AFIO). Born in Edinburgh, Scotland, Peter grew up in the Washington, D.C. area and attended local schools. On graduation from Georgetown University, he was commissioned in the U.S. Marine Corps and served with the Fleet Marine Force in the Far East. He is married and lives in McLean, Virginia.
