



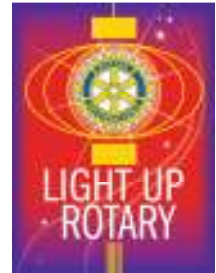

This week's speaker will be Christopher Guith and his topic will be America's Changing Energy Landscape



Christopher Guith is the Senior Vice President for Policy at the Institute for 21st Century Energy, an affiliate of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. At the Energy Institute, he develops the Chamber's positions and strategy relating to energy and the environment and spends much of his time collaborating with state and local Chambers around the country. As a recognized energy policy expert, he's testified before Congress on issues as varied as clean energy financing to nuclear power to offshore development. Prior to the Energy Institute, Guith served as the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Energy, as well as Legislative Counsel for two members of Congress. A native Californian, he's been an Arlington resident for 15 years.

America's Changing Energy Landscape. The US is in the midst of the most dramatic change in energy development the world has ever seen. The country is in the early stages of technological revolution that is making us the largest energy producer in the world and creating millions of jobs, trillions in government revenue, and securing our energy future in the process. At the same time efforts to limit greenhouse gas emissions stand to significantly change how and where we get energy, as well as the energy's reliability and cost.
