- 2. Speaker: Award-Winning Photographer Lloyd Wolf on his book
“Living Diversity – The Columbia Pike Project”**



We welcome back award-winning Arlington-based photographer Lloyd Wolf, whose work is in the collections of the Library of Congress, the Corcoran Museum of Art, the Museum of Jewish Heritage, and others. He has done assignments for The National Geographic Explorer, the Washington Post Magazine, AFL-CIO, People, Vogue, the National Institutes of Health, and many other institutions. In 1980 he was awarded an NEA grant for a photographic study of Arlington, Virginia [members will recall his earlier presentation to us on this about 18 (?) months ago]. He has published several books, including: “Jewish Mothers: Strength Wisdom Compassion,” “Jewish Fathers: A Legacy of Love” and “Facing the Wall: Americans at the Vietnam War Memorial.”

Today, he will talk about his latest book, Living Diversity: The Columbia Pike Documentary Project, recently published by the University of Virginia Press. It is a project Mr. Wolf did in collaboration with four other noted local photographers. Columbia Pike is one of the most ethnically diverse neighborhoods in the world, and is notable for the relative harmony between widely disparate immigrant and native communities. This beautiful and meaningful book is the result of a seven-year documentary effort. Mr. Wolf will have copies available for sale/signing at \$40, payment by cash or check.
