## **Midday Program: July 21, 12:15 PM at the WGCC Tom Moncure, University Counsel, George Mason University “George Mason”**



Mr. Moncure will speak on George Mason (the man, not the university), with emphasis on his strength of character and his central role in forming our government.

Tom Moncure was named University Counsel for George Mason University by Attorney General Judith Williams Jادgmann in January 2006. Prior to this appointment, he had served as Senior Counsel to two Attorneys General with the primary responsibility of managing Special (outside) Counsel throughout the Commonwealth. Additional duties as Senior Counsel involved the active representation of several state agencies – to include one educational institution – and the drafting of official legal opinions. He served as the Attorney General’s designee on the Virginia Military Advisory Council and the Virginia Freedom of Information Advisory Council.

Admitted to the Virginia Bar in 1979, Mr. Moncure began his legal career as a general trial practitioner in courts of the Commonwealth. He was also appointed by the Circuit Judges as Assistant Commissioner of Accounts with the responsibility for auditing and approving fiduciary reports. Additionally, he was appointed by the Supreme Court of Virginia to serve on Medical Malpractice Review Panels. Other significant legal experience includes as Assistant General Counsel for the National Rifle Association and as Clerk of the Circuit Court for the County of Stafford. Legal publications include two law review articles and book reviews for *The Virginia Lawyer*. Mr. Moncure is a former member of the Virginia House of Delegates where he served on the Courts of Justice Committee. He is currently in his third term as appointee of the Speaker of the House to the Virginia Code Commission. He is a retired career Military Police Officer in the Army National Guard and Army Reserves, following 26 years of commissioned service.
