Dr. Sigrid Frye-Revere

“Kidneys, and Livers, and Lungs – Oh My!”



In the United States, it costs more to donate an organ than to get one. Giving an organ, like receiving one, is a life-changing event. We believe living donors are heroes and should get all the financial and social support they need to limit the burdens of their donation.

Dr. Sigrid Frye-Revere is the Founder and President of Stop Organ Trafficking Now!, a non-partisan 501(c)(4) working to increase living organ donation and to reduce the number of Americans who purchase organs on the black market (www.stoporgantraffickingnow.org). She is also the Founder and President of the Center for Ethical Solutions, a non-partisan non-profit, 501(c)(3) that educates the public on critical issues in patient-care ethics (www.ethical-solutions.org). Having most recently served as the Director of Bioethics Studies at the Cato Institute, Ms. Frye-Revere has enjoyed an extensive career in the field of Bioethics and Health Policy. Her academic positions have included serving as Adjunct Professor of Healthcare Law and Ethics at the University of Virginia's Center for Biomedical Ethics, and Adjunct Professor of Ethics and Health Care Law at George Mason University's College of Nursing and Health Science. She has practiced Bioethics, Health, and FDA Law for Arent Fox Kinter Plotkin & Kahn, and has been nominated to serve as the medical ethicist on the Organ and Tissue Advisory Committee of the Washington Regional Transplant Community.
