Stephanie Burns, of Citizens' Climate Lobby
will speak on "The Best Solution to Climate Change"



Stephanie Burns leads the Alexandria chapter of Citizens' Climate Lobby (CCL). CCL is a non-profit, non-partisan, grassroots organization focused on national policies to address climate change. Its mission is to build the political will for a livable world. To achieve this mission, thousands of CCL volunteers from across the country meet with members of Congress and reach out to their communities to advocate for a policy called Carbon Fee and Dividend.

Outside of CCL, Stephanie has enjoyed working as a researcher and data analyst for a wide range of non-profit, for-profit, and government organizations. She has a degree in economics from the University of Mary Washington.

Member Alan Button did his autobiographical "classification talk," relating his journey from a small farm in Pennsylvania where his father was a tree farmer, to becoming one of the nation's, and the world's, paper pulp experts, centered mainly in Appleton, Wisconsin.
