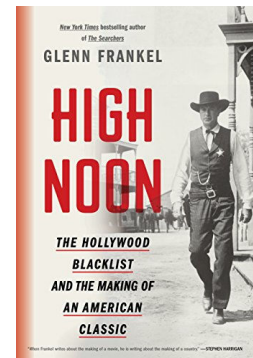
## Thursday, July 12 - Lunch Program at the WGCC, 12:00-1:30

### Glenn Frankel, Journalist and Author “High Noon: The Hollywood Blacklist and the Making of An American Classic”



Glenn Frankel worked for many years for the Washington Post, serving as bureau chief in London, Southern Africa, and Jerusalem, where he won the 1989 Pulitzer Prize for International Reporting for “balanced and sensitive reporting” of Israel and the Palestinians. He went on to teach journalism at Stanford University and the University of Texas at Austin, where he directed the School of Journalism.

As an author, Frankel has won the National Jewish Book Award and was a finalist for the Los Angeles Times Book Prize. His last book, *The Searchers: The Making of an American Legend* (Bloomsbury, 2013), was a national bestseller and named one of Library Journal’s top ten books of 2013. His newest is *High Noon: The Hollywood Blacklist and the Making of an American Classic*, which the Washington Post called “a sumptuous history” and the Los Angeles Times praised for its “grace and accuracy.” Mr. Frankel will have the book available for sale and signing, or will sign the copy you bring.
